Dave has been fundraising for cancer support for a long time and now wished to set up a cancer support group in Chesterfield. Dave said he already has the support of Chesterfield Borough Council who has allowed him a few rooms in the Market hall. Dave is hoping to set up a Drop In Centre where other sufferers can call in for support and information. It is hoped to be open by late may – early June 2010. As part of his fundraising campaign, Dave's Sons Tony and Tim are to do a cycle ride from **John O'Groats to Lands End** starting on May 9<sup>th</sup> and should be passing through Chesterfield on Friday 14<sup>th</sup>. Dave has produced a sponsor form and the Secretary has agreed to photocopy it and circulate it around branches. Colin suggested a branch donation and it was agreed to donate but wait until after the meeting with Kalvinder for an agreed amount.
